Visit the oldest and largest public observatory in Germany!

The attendees of the EPSC2018 are cordially invited to join a 1.5 hour guided tour (in English or German) of the large telescopes, a Zeiss Kleinplanetarium and the sky-scientific museum.

The Archenhold Observatory is situated amid the Treptower Park.

The trademark of the Archenhold Observatory is the giant telescope, which was built in 1896. With its 21 meters focal length, it is the longest fully movable lens telescope on earth. It is also one of the ten most powerful lens telescopes in the world with a lens diameter of 680 millimeters. The colossus weighs a total of 130 tons and is still fully operational today.

The tour is free of charge. A donation to the observatory is appreciated.

HOW TO GET THERE
urban rail (S-Bahn)
S8, S9 -> Plänterwald
S8, S9, S41, S42, S85 -> Treptower Park
bus
165, 166, 265, N65 -> H Alt-Treptow

By car: Turn into Bulgarische Straße, then turn left (one-way
street) into the street Alt-Treptow. The observatory is on the left
after 100 m.

Public parking spaces
are available about
50 m further on the
right at the restaurant
"Eierschale-Zenner" or
in the Bulgarische
Straße.

Starting from the EPSC venue it takes about one hour to get to the observatory by urban rail (S-Bahn).

10 min walk to station Tiergarten Tiergarten S3, S5, S7 → Ostkreuz Ostkreuz S8, S9 → Plänterwald 12 min walk from station Plänterwald

or

Tiergarten S9 → Plänterwald
